



All students 30 years of age or less are required to submit proof of immunization to measles, mumps, rubella, and Hepatitis B as a condition for continued enrollment (N.J.S.A. 18A: 61D-1). This immunization requirement may be satisfied by either vaccination or blood test. Additional immunization requirements may be required for specific degree programs that include clinical rotations and externships. Students of the completion (online) programs are exempt from this immunization requirement.

Below are the specific vaccination requirements:

1. Hepatitis B: Three doses of a hepatitis B containing vaccine, or alternatively any two doses of a hepatitis B vaccine licensed and approved for a two-dose regimen administered to the student between 11 through 15 years of age
2. Two doses of measles vaccine and one dose of mumps and rubella. Two MMR vaccines are also acceptable.

The following documents are acceptable as evidence of immunization and the date it was administered:

1. Completed Official EIC Immunization Form signed and stamped by a physician
2. A record from any public health department
3. Immunization record signed by a physician

Exemptions to these immunization requirements may be granted for the following:

1. Medical (e.g. pregnancy) with a supporting document (e.g. Physician's statement or note)
2. Religious reason supported by a statement signed by an official of the religious organization
3. Students born before January 1, 1957 are exempt from the Hepatitis B vaccination
