Misrepresentation Policy

Federal regulations (34 C.F.R. §§ 668.71-75) prohibits any misrepresentation and misleading statements in all communications and information, particularly to a student, prospective student, and family of an enrolled or prospective student regarding the **nature of the college's educational programs, the college's financial charges, employability of the college's graduates, and the college's relationship with the Department of Education.**

Definitions

Misleading statement: Any statement that has the likelihood or tendency to deceive

Statement: Any communication made in writing, visually, orally, or through other means

Misrepresentation: Any erroneous, incorrect, inaccurate or misleading statement made by the college or any of its representatives directly or indirectly to a student, prospective student or any member of the public, or to an accrediting agency, State agency, or to the Secretary of Education. It includes the dissemination of a student endorsement or testimonial that a student gives under undue duress or because the institution required the student to make such an endorsement or testimonial to participate in a program

Disciplinary Action

Any EIC employee who violates this policy may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination of employment.
